

## **RESOLUTION 2012-21**

## RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING REIMBURSEMENT PROCEDURE FOR QUALIFIED LOW INCOME ELDERLY FOR RELIEF FROM COUNTY WIDE MOTOR VEHICLE TAX IF SUCH IS PASSED BY REFERENDUM IN BRADLEY COUNTY

WHEREAS, the Bradley County Commission adopted Amended Resolution 2012-13 to call a referendum on the question of whether a county-wide motor vehicle tax (hereinafter "Wheel Tax") should be levied for Bradley County; and

WHEREAS, in the event that such Wheel Tax is passed, the Bradley County Commission would like to establish a procedure to reimburse any amounts paid for the Wheel Tax by qualified and approved low income elderly motor-vehicle owners who are 65 years old or older AND have an individual annual income equal to or less that \$14,100 per year; and

**WHEREAS**, the qualifications for the low income elderly relief can be changed by a majority vote of the Bradley County Commission.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the county legislative body of Bradley County meeting in session at Bradley County Tennessee, Tennessee, on the  $2^{nd}$  day of April, 2012 that the following procedure is established for reimbursement of Wheel Tax amounts paid by qualified and approved low income elderly:

**Section 1:** Applications for reimbursement will created by the County Commission and will be available in the Bradley County Clerk's Office in September of 2012. The application will provide the specific information that must be provided in order to qualify for the reimbursement. Once completed, the application will be returned to the County Commission Office for review.

**Section 2:** In order to establish age and income requirements, a driver's license or birth certificate and an income tax return or current year social security statement if income tax form was not filed will be required to be submitted with the application for reimbursement along with any other information or documentation listed in the application.

**Section 3:** A committee appointed by the County Commission Chairman of five (5) County Commissioners will meet as needed to review and make recommendations to the County Commission for reimbursement. The decision of the County Commission is final.

**Section 4:** A qualified low income elderly can apply for reimbursement for up to two (2) vehicles each calendar year. The vehicle must be owned and used by the qualified low income elderly individual.
